General Description

Beyond Identity: A Gendered Platform for Activist-Scholars

The Politics of Sexual Violence Initiative, The Department of Anthropology, Gender Studies, and International Studies, The Colin Powell School for Civic and Global Engagement, and The President's Office at the City College of the City University of New York invites applications for a one year postdoctoral fellowship in the College's new program, "Beyond Identity: A Gendered Platform for Activist-Scholars" to begin in July 2017. This initiative aims to train a select group of students in identity-driven analyses that link the lived experiences of immigrant and U.S.-based minority students to inform unique research agendas that expressly build stronger political movements and create solidarity among immigrant and minority communities.

Other Duties

The Fellow will be affiliated with The Politics of Sexual Violence Initiative and The Department of Anthropology, Gender Studies, and International Studies. The Fellow is expected to teach a year-long course to a core cohort of student participants on one or more of the following areas: gender, violence, immigration, social movements, and Diaspora Studies. Additionally, a four to six hour weekly commitment to mentoring participating students will be required. Instructors teaching in the program will help guide students on individual research projects that link research agendas with personal experiences and cultural knowledge from countries in conflict as they intersect with activist struggles in the United States and globally.

The salary is \$60,000 with health benefits.

QUALIFICATIONS

Applicants must have received the Ph.D. or equivalent degree after September 2014 and before July 2017. We are particularly interested in scholars whose work focuses on gender, violence, race and immigration, and social movements. Applicants who have or are developing an activist-scholar approach to their research and write for broad audiences are encouraged to apply.
