The staff member should have experience in operating basic machinery (i.e., field lining, gator), working in adverse weather conditions (i.e., rain, snow, heat), pushing, pulling and lifting up to 50 pounds; working nights, weekends, and holidays, and be able to work with a diverse cliental.
