General Description

Queens College is seeking an Athletic Trainer/Olympic Sports Coordinator. This is a full-time (including benefits) position reporting to the Director of Sports Medicine, who serves under the Student Athlete Performance area in the Department of Athletics and Recreation.

Duties include, but are not limited to: general healthcare assistance to 275 intercollegiate student-athletes (injury evaluations, referrals, rehabilitative treatments); provide necessary practice and game coverage for all intercollegiate teams (including travel, late nights, early mornings, weekends, holidays and during inclement weather); assist in summer camp coverage; and assist with monitoring and maintenance of the athletic training room.

As the Olympic Sports Coordinator, the candidate will assist the Director of Sports Medicine with insurance tracking and documentation, scheduling of doctor visits, assist in the recruitment and scheduling of per diem staffers and sharing medical challenges and recovery plans with Head Coaches.

The individual must have the mobility to do the following activities: running, walking, sitting, climbing, balancing, kneeling, crouching or crawling. Candidates must have the ability to lift and/or move heavy items weighing up to 50 pounds on a frequent basis with or without assistance.

Position may require attending national and conference meetings; as well as performing other duties assigned by the Director of Sports Medicine.
