Queens College is seeking an Assistant Athletic Trainer. This is a part-time position reporting to the Director of Sports Medicine, who serves under the Student Athlete Performance area in the athletics department.

Duties include, but are not limited to, general healthcare assistance to all intercollegiate student-athletes (injury evaluations, referrals, treatments, rehabilitation, and record keeping); providing necessary practice and game coverage for all intercollegiate teams (including travel, nights-some late, weekends, holidays, and during inclement weather); assisting in summer camp coverage; assisting with the monitoring and maintaining of the athletic training room; assisting the Director of Sports Medicine with insurance tracking and documentation; attending national and conference meetings; and performing other duties assigned by the Director of Sports Medicine.

The Queens College department of athletics offers varsity, intramural and recreational athletics opportunities to members of its campus community. The college sponsors 19 varsity sports at the NCAA Division II level, with the Knights competing predominantly in the East Coast Conference.
