The part-time position offers a salary of \$35,000, where as the full-time position, which includes a dual-role opportunity within the department, offers a salary of \$65,000. Both salaries are negotiable based on experience and qualifications. The Head Coach will be responsible for leading the program, planning and the development of the NCAA Division II basketball program competing in the East Coast Conference.

This position is responsible for but not limited to, the recruitment and retention of quality student-athletes; individual instruction; team training; player management; organization of team non-competitive related activities such as community service activities, fundraising, and alumni events; and the overall oversite of the program that must abide by all NCAA, ECC, CUNY, and Queens College rules and regulations.
