The OSHA 30 instructor will also assess students' knowledge of the course content and provide clarification, review and reinforcement of course content as needed.

Additionally, the OSHA 30 Instructor will process and prepare OSHA 30 cards for students who successfully complete the course and bring cards to the Workforce Development Program Assistant, and provide feedback to the CSSSTP's program staff about students' performance, attendance and classroom conduct.
