

## **Examples of External Funding Opportunities**

There are four basic types of funding sources:

**I. Government** - many government agencies provide funding to individuals and teams of researchers to work on specific types of research projects. Examples of government agencies that provide financial support include:

The National Science Foundation (NSF) (science, engineering, and education)

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) (health, science and engineering related to health)

The Department of Energy (DOE) (energy science, innovation, economy, security, and safety)

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) (aerospace science and engineering)

<u>U.S. Department of Health & Human Services</u> (HHS) (medicine, public health, and social services)

The U.S. Department of Education's e-Grants

**II. Private Industry** - many private companies provide grants and/or materials and supplies in support of research. Examples of companies that provide targeted support include:

Honda (e.g., fuel cells and robotics)

DuPont; (e.g., polymer science broadly defined)

L'Oreal (research on personal care products)

**III. Foundations** - foundations are another good source of funding for research. Examples of foundations that provide financial support to researchers include: <u>Foundations & Grantmakers</u> <u>Directory</u>

**Howard Hughes Medical Institute (HHMI)** 

Research Corporation for Science Advancement (RC)

The Camille and Henry Dreyfus Foundation

**IV. Professional Organizations** - represent still another possible source of funding for your research project. Examples of professional organizations that provide support for research include:
